

Fresh Forces collects personal data

We may collect your (personal) details when you visit our website and/or use the functionalities on the site

Below, we will explain in short terms which data we collect, why we do this and how we (don't) use the data. We also explain how you will know which data we obtain from you and how you can send us a request to delete your data. By using our site, you agree to what is stated below.

The data collected by Fresh Forces and when this is done

Visiting the Fresh Forces website: when you visit our website, we don't collect any data that can be traced back to individual people. We do, however, store aggregated data to analyse and improve the quality of our website.

When using the contact form on the Fresh Forces website: when you fill out and send the contact form on our website, then the (personal) details you disclosed will be used to contact you.

When filling out the job application form on the Fresh Forces website: when you fill out the job application form on our website, the (personal) details you submit, including attachments such as your CV, will be filed and stored in our Applicant Tracker System. This is necessary to start and follow up on the application process. After the process, the data is retained for analysis and optimisation purposes regarding our application process.

How do I know which of my details are disclosed to Fresh Forces and what can I do about that?

If you want to know exactly which of your personal details we have, then please contact us by sending an email to info@frisseblikken.com and we will let you know as soon as possible. You will then be able to indicate whether there are any specific details that you don't want us to retain (any longer). We will delete and/or anonymise these details so that they no longer refer to you as an individual.

How will Fresh Forces never use your details?

It goes without saying that Fresh Forces will only use your personal data for the purpose you gave it to us. We will never disclose your personal data to third parties without your explicit consent.
